



Take a stroll down to the Cahokia Courthouse on the Ten Toe Express

TOTAL WALK DISTANCE: 0.23 mile from MetroBus; 4.6 miles from MetroLink

Built in 1740 and transformed into a courthouse in 1793, the Cahokia Courthouse lives on as the oldest of its kind in all of Illinois. This log courthouse is a fine example of the French Colonial architecture and stands today as a museum open to the public for free tours. Visiting, one can learn not only the history of the incredible structure, but also read up on several issues that came before the court back in the day.

Directions from MetroLink:

- Take MetroLink to 5th & Missouri Station
- Walk to 5th & Missouri Loop from MetroLink
- Transfer to MetroBus #2 toward Cahokia

Directions from MetroBus:

- Take MetroBus #2 towards Cahokia to Cahokia via Water Street (runs about every half hour).
- Exit at IL-3 at West 3rd Street.
- Walk north on Lower Cahokia Road/Mississippi Avenue/Water Street toward W. 2nd Street.
- Turn left at West 2nd Street.
- Turn right at Elm Street.
- End walk at 107 Elm Street.
- Retrace your steps to return to the MetroBus stop.
