

Ten Toes Express to Crown Candy in Old North Neighborhood

TOTAL WALK DISTANCE: *Approximately 1 mile*

Directions:

- Take MetroLink to Civic Center then transfer to #30 northbound or take MetroLink to Rock Road Station and transfer to #30 southbound. Exit the bus on St. Louis Avenue near 14th St.

Alternate Route:

- Take #74 Florissant from Civic Center or Flo Valley CC. Exit the bus from N. Florissant near St. Louis Ave.
- Begin your walk from Crown Candy at St. Louis and 14th.
- Turn toward the Arch! Walk south on 14th for 4 blocks. You will pass the ONSL office on your left and Marx hardware, a family business since 1875, on your right.
- Turn right on North Market St. to view many new and restored houses. (North Market St. was part of North St. Louis, a separate town 1816 - 1841.)
- Walk two blocks to N. Florissant, then turn around to walk east four blocks on N. Market as far as Jackson Place Park.
- Turn back on N. Market to turn right on 13th St. Follow 13th St. back to St. Louis Ave. passing the new Co-op on the way.
