



Take a peaceful stroll on the Ted Jones Trail on the Ten Toes Express

TOTAL WALK DISTANCE: 2.2 - 5 miles

The Ted Jones Trail is a multi-use paved path two miles long connecting the University of Missouri to downtown Ferguson. It is roughly parallel to Florissant Road, offering a peaceful tree-lined alternative. If you walk to Ferguson on a Saturday morning, you will find yourself in the Ferguson Farmers Market (in the parking lot near Aldi's).

If you continue a little farther to the Whistle Stop Cafe - located in the former railroad depot next to the trestle - you can enjoy refreshments, learn about the importance of railroads in Ferguson, and perhaps watch freight trains pass by.

Directions:

- Take MetroLink to UMSL North Station.
- Exit left from the train and walk left across the parking lot next to MetroLink.
- Turn left alongside Bellerive Drive, the road going underneath MetroLink.
- Bear right at the bottom of the hill to enter the Trail which will then bend to the left.

The Trail runs through a 392-foot tunnel below I-70, about .5 mile from UMSL. The tunnel is decorated with a 3-D mural created by local artists and high-school students.

If you are tired of walking when you reach Ferguson, MetroBus #45 Hazelwood-Ferguson returns you to MetroLink at North Hanley Station. The bus stop is under the trestle.
